“Faith in the Public Sphere”

For the past six months or so, I have been a participant in a program through Pepperdine University called COMMUNITAS. It brings together a cohort of Christian clergy and faith leaders from the greater LA area to create communities and provide resources on a variety of issues that affect our communities. Our first session was in January and focused on building communities within our congregations. The second session, in March, was on education issues.

For most of our sessions, we come together on the Pepperdine campus in Malibu. This past week, the 15 members of the cohort, plus our two Pepperdine guides (and plus one 10-week-old baby), traveled to Washington, D.C. Our time and focus were on the subject of faith in the public sphere.

It was certainly an apt time to be in the nation’s capital thinking about this issue. We toured the Capitol on the day Senator John McCain returned to DC. That same day, we walked past activists demonstrating against the repeal; they were gathered on the steps of Lutheran Church of the Reformation, the ELCA congregation just a block from the Supreme Court. In the few days we were in DC, the Senate passed a procedural vote on their plan to repeal the ACA—and then failed to pass the bill itself.

In our program, we had a very busy four days in the capital. After the tour of the Capitol Building, we went to Arlington National Cemetery. We went to the offices of Sojourners Magazine. We met with representatives of World Vision, the Arab Center DC, and the Institutional Religious Freedom Alliance. We had a little bit of free time to explore the National Mall—I visited the Hirshhorn Museum and the National Gallery of Art.

One of our conveners from Pepperdine, John Barton, said something our first morning in DC that has stuck with me. He said, “The world does not need more political religion. We have more than enough of that. What the world does need is more religious people who are politically engaged.”



As Christians, our faith is our primary identity, Christ our primary allegiance. But we are also citizens, members of political communities—local, national, and global. Unless we choose to live a monastic lifestyle, removed from the world, then our lives will necessarily intersect with political matters. Whether it is healthcare for the most vulnerable, or economic opportunity, or stewardship of the environment, our faith engages with political matters.



In Matthew 25, Jesus tells a parable of the final judgment. “The king will say to those at his right hand, ‘Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.’ Then the righteous will answer him, ‘Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?’ And the king will answer them, ‘Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.’”

Our faith tells us that our actions towards the “least of these” is what we do to our Lord. So as we look at the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the sick, the imprisoned—as we consider the political decisions that affect the least of these is our own community and our own country—our faith calls us to respond. We are people of faith, and the world needs people of faith like us who are willing to be engaged in the public sphere.

Please consider giving a few hours of your time to help this outreach. It is so important.






